
Background

Remember...the 2014 guild challenge project

This annual event is presented in Feb. and needs to be finished and anonymously presented at the July meeting where each person will be invited to vote for their 3 favorite projects. These wall hangings will be displayed at the Seward County Fair where fairgoers will also have a chance to vote for their favorite. Winners of both votes will be announced in August, identities will be revealed, and prizes awarded.

Baby clothes, wedding dresses, Grandma's apron, t-shirts, embroidered linens...How precious are these items that stir so many memories! We challenge you to create a wall quilt that helps you remember an earlier time, special person, event or anything. You might include vintage fabrics, pictures or embellishments that help you remember. Or, you might recreate a memory by appliqueing or embroidering a picture. Let your imagination run wild and create something special.

Rules: 1. Create a quilted item that invokes a memory for you. 2. The combined length out of outside edges (perimeter) cannot exceed 144 inches. These will be displayed at the Seward County Fair and our space is limited. You can make it as small as you like.

3. Bring your finished item to our July 21 meeting in a brown bag.

In memory of DeElda Hershberger, Simple Appeal by Kim Diehl has been purchased and donated to Seward Memorial Library. It contains 14 patchwork and applique projects for everyday living. Look for it there and consider making a project to remind you of the dear lady who was part of our guild and an inspiration to many.

Use that shop's row in your quilt and win a bonus prize! Exclusive Fabric Plates by Zebra Patterns will be available in shops around the country. Each one is unique! Collect a bunch to create fun projects, sewing studio wall art or even a fun backing for your quilt.

The Row by Row Experience

Each area has their own Facebook page. Like the page from the areas you visit to see pics of the rows, shop displays, winning quilts and fabric plate projects.

Row by Row began in 2011 with 20 quilt shops across New York State. In 2012 the event grew to include 62 participating shops. Pennsylvania came on board in 2013 for a total of 138 shops throughout the two states. In 2014 the event is moving across the country. Over 20 states are participating and planning fun for quilters nationwide. Althought the quilt shops are organized by state, quilters have no borders. Travel, shop, collect patterns and add rows to your quilt from any area.

It's early, but not too early to plan your entries for the **Seward County Fair** (August 7-10) and the **Nebraska State Fair** (August 22-September 1). There are many categories and prizes in each one including a special County Fair prize this year for two color quilts.

Please think about which of your wonderful quilts may work with that theme, and make plans to share with the residents, their families and the community.
