Fair time is almost here!

You may be a person that hesitates to bring a quilt to the fair. But it's a wonderful opportunity to share your work with your friends and neighbors as well as receive helpful critiques, both things done well and ways to improve.

I think Seward County Fair is one of the nicest and best run county fairs in our state. They always have an experienced judge that provides helpful comments to the maker. This year, the quilts will be displayed at Harvest Hall during the fair so we will get to see more of them.

The Nebraska State Fair is another opportunity for sharing you work with an even bigger audience. Since the State Fair moved to Grand Island in 2010, we've typically had 600 or more quilts exhibited in the Open Class Domestic Quilt Department. A Nationally Quilting Association Certified Judge works three days to judge the entire quilt show. All quilt entries receive written comments -both positive and areas for improvement. Unlike 4-H, you don't have to exhibit your quilts in the county fair to exhibit at the Nebraska State Fair open class although it's good to do both.

The entry deadline for the State Fair Quilt Dept is <u>midnight</u>, <u>Aug 10</u>. You can enter either online at <u>www.statefair.org</u>, by mail-in or by contacting Dorothy Heidemann-Nelson at 402-730-6146.

We are lucky because Seward is one of the two drop-off return sites for getting your domestic entries (quilts, textile arts, fine arts, photography, canned goods, education and bee culture) to and from Grand Island. This year the drop-off date is Aug 14 from 12-5 pm, the last day of the Seward County Fair, so you can bring your released items directly to the drop-off collection site in Harvest Hall. And after the state fair is over, you can pick them up again on Sep 7th at the same location.

Bed Turning Fundraiser

Dear Guild Members, Our fund raiser, "Luncheon and Bed Turning Event" is fast approaching. Committee members have been preparing and we would like members to purchase their tickets at our next guild meeting. Tickets are \$10.
