February Meeting

This month's meeting may be a little noisier and little more active than those featuring a lecture or trunk show program! We are going to get together for a working meeting in which we will bring any supplies we need, machines if we choose, cutting boards, ironing boards and all the quilt making paraphernalia we can carry so that we can create quilts to benefit the Orphan Grain Train and Project Linus. Quilts from infant size up to twin size are accepted by these two organizations and benefit young people and families in need of the special comfort a warm, colorful quilt can provide.

If you don't have scraps (really?...let's talk) or don't feel like doing any actual stitching, some completed tops will be on hand for tying and binding. If you have some lengths of fabric for backs that you don't think you'll be using or some extra batting to donate they would be put to good use on project night.

And this meeting will be different, too, in that we'll set up and get started at 5:30, have a snack at 6:30 followed by a short business meeting and show & Tell and then whomever wishes to may stay and sew. Come help us complete lots of donations for these two terrific organizations!

Also remember to bring your garage sale items this month! The Havelock Crafter/Quilter sale is coming up later in February so it's time to grab a box or bag and dig in to the spillover in your sewing room. Please price your donated items, it will be a help to those working on sale day.

QUILTING WITH YOUR EYES CLOSED

Do you suffer from color anxiety; have fabric phobias? Perhaps you experience periodic bouts of match-itis? Your guild is here to help! In March we'll be offering therapy in the form of a new project called "Quilting With Your Eyes Closed".

Its a simple, fun exercise that will reduce stress when you are choosing fabrics for all your future quilt projects.

We'll start with one of our favorite things...strips! To participate we will bring a total of 18 3" x 18" fabric strips to the March meeting. They can be any color(s) but please bring 6 light, 6 medium and 6 dark strips.

At the meeting everyone's light strips will be mixed together, our mediums together and our darks together. We will then, with eyes closed, choose a light, a medium and a dark strip and keep these three together. The process will be repeated six times by each participant so we'll be taking home just as much fabric as we brought.

At home we'll choose a simple block with which to work. The Shoo Fly pattern provided may be used but a Churn Dash, a Jacob's Ladder or any block that uses just three fabrics will work. You can make all the same block or mix together as many different ones as you like. Its your project and block size is up to you as long as you can use your 3" strips.

Make as many blocks as you like with the combinations just as they were chosen at the meeting and then arrange them as desired (side by side, on point, with sashing or any way you like) and bring the result to the September meeting to show off your brilliant "color" sense and help show us all that, when it comes to fabric choice, color VALUE is the key!

Shoo Fly Block Cut 2 light and 2 medium 2 7/8" squares and cut diagonally for 1/2 square triangles (A) Cut 4 light 2 1/2 inch squares. (B) Cut one dark 2 1/2" square (B) Join pieces as shown in diagram



BVQG 2012 CHALLENGE — HOME SWEET HOMESTEAD

In honor of the 150th anniversary of the Homestead Act, our challenge this year is to make a quilt representative of what "homestead" means to you. It may evoke the pioneer spirit in you or bring to mind a home from your past, your current beloved "nest" or any structure man made, animal created, or natural that serves as a home. It could even be a quilt made from some type of block with a "homey" name but do include at least one log cabin block somewhere on the front of your quilt and add some lace, rick-rack or ribbon to the front too. Maximum size should be 144" all the way 'round (to accommodate space limitations at the fair); no minimum size...miniatures welcome! Quilts must have finished edges and be quilted. Choose your own fabrics; no packet this time. Have fun, be creative and bring the result to the July meeting!

The business meeting was started by acknowledging our members with January birthdays. Becky asked them to share their New Year's Quilt Resolutions. Door prize was won by Jeanie Hecker.

November meeting minutes & November treasurer's report were approved as printed in the January newsletter.

Members were reminded to pay dues in Jan. so they will be included in the 2012 yearbook. Any changes in contact information should go to Becky and she will forward to Pat.

Several members have already signed up for the Fons & Porter magazine offer, open to Guild members until the end of March. Subscriptions are \$15 & include 2 free booklets and 3 free spools of Sulky thread. There will be 2 more chances, at the Feb. & Mar. meetings to take advantage of the offer.

Becky and Roxanne O'Hare explained our first Fundraiser/Service project of 2012 = The Quilter's/Crafter's Garage Sale to be held by Roxanne's small quilt group at the Misty Isles in Havelock 2/26, 10 a.m. - 4 p.m. Our two tables will cost the guild \$10 each which will go to the Lincoln Food Bank. The Guild will continue to have our free Sew Days in 2012 on the last Saturday of each odd-numbered month (except November) from 9 a.m - 4 p.m. Drop in or stay all day 3/31, 5/26, 7/28, 9/29.

It was suggested that we might make a raffle quilt using the extra 2011 challenge fabric as a focus. More info to come. Contact Becky Reisinger if interested in getting involved in this project.

Roxann O'Hare donated a quilt top for the Cattlemen's Ball pending Doug Brand's willingness to pay to have it quilted. Doug had offered to pay for materials. Roxanne will figure the price for the quilting and the guild will contact Doug.
