# **July Meeting**

On Monday, July 16th at 7:00 p.m. we'll meet once again at the Seward Civic Center for friendship, inspiration and, this month, a bit of mystery and intrigue (always a good thing!) on MOVIE NIGHT! Without knowing which Homestead challenge quilt belongs to which mystery quilt maker, we will vote on our favorites while we, of course, do our best Sherlock Holmes imitations collecting clues of style and color to try to figure out the mystery of who in the guild "done it"!

Or perhaps the documentary is your favorite movie genre? Gotcha covered there too! As our own Janalee Petsch (talk about a great documentarian!) tells us:

Today, every time a person listens to TV, reads a paper, or is on the internet, you'll hear the phrase, "there's an app for that". In the world of quilting, there is also a DVD for that, whatever 'that' might be. July's program is all about sit back, relax, and watch a short DVD called Soft Power, produced by the University of Nebraska, School of Journalism. This DVD gives multiple examples and reasons why quilting is a lot more than just fabric and thread. Quilting has power. A discussion about the variety of quilting DVDs available to quilters of all levels and interests will follow. It's movie night at the BVQG theater.

How are those strippy little projects coming along? If you have sets of strips from our exchange it's time to get started! Remember that the aim is to let the quilt "happen". No over thinking or over planning. This is a color exercise. Have fun and really PLAY!

Step one is to choose a simple block with which to work. The Shoo Fly pattern provided may be used but a Churn Dash, a Jacob's Ladder or any block that uses just three fabrics will work. You can make all the same block or mix together as many different ones as you like. Its your project and block size is up to you as long as you use your 3" strips.

Make as many blocks as you like with the combinations just as they were chosen at the meeting and then arrange them as desired (side by side, on point, with sashing or any way you like) and bring the result to the September meeting to show off your brilliant "color" sense and help show us all that, when it comes to fabric choice, color VALUE is the key!

### Shoo Fly Block


Cut 2 light and 2 medium 2 7/8" squares and cut diagonally for 1/2 square triangles (A)

Cut 4 light 2 1/2 inch squares. (B)

Cut one dark 2 1/2" square (B)

Join pieces as shown in diagram

Mix values at will, but use all 3 in each block!



### BVQG 2012 CHALLENGE — HOME SWEET HOMESTEAD

Its time to take the wraps off your Home Sweet Homestead challenge quilt! Well, not until about midway through the July meeting! Bring your finished project to the upcoming meeting in a non see through bag of some kind and quietly hand it off to Vice President, Jeannie Hecker when you arrive. All the completed homestead quilts will be displayed at the meeting and each member may put in a vote for her favorite. Jeannie will keep the quilts until the county fair a few weeks later and they will also be displayed there behind our white glovers table. Fairgoers will also be able to weigh in on a favorite. At the August meeting those quilt makers whose quilts have received the most votes will get a little something to celebrate their success!

If you want to whip something up "right quick", remember the guidelines…include at least one log cabin block on the front of the quilt, make something representative of the theme, Home Sweet Homestead, and complete your no larger than 144" around project with some manner of quilting and finished edges.

#### 2012 Nebraska State Fair News

We are adding 4 new competition classes and 5 new special contests to the existing 70 competition classes and 18 special contests from last year.

The new classes are: a quilt from recycled components (i.e. old quilt blocks/tops or fabric or item originally designated for a purpose other than a quilt), a doll quilt class for adults (this is in addition to the two doll quilt classes for youth) and two additional Senior Adult classes (a throw quilt size and a bed quilt, mixed techniques).

The new special contests are: Best Scrappy Quilt, Best Humorous Quilt, Best Blue & White Quilt, Best Quilt from Southwest Nebraska Counties (Red Willow, Hitchcock, Dundy, Chase, Frontier & Hayes), and the Diamond Award to the best bed quilt in the Senior Adult classes made by someone 75 or over.

Can you help with White Gloving? We will need about 240 white glove workers during the eleven days of the State Fair from Aug. 24 through Sept. 3. There are three shifts per day: 9am-1pm, 1pm-5pm, and 5pm-9pm. Consider getting a group from your local guild to car pool, white glove and then see the rest of the wonderful fair. You will receive a free entry ticket to the fair on the day you work. White glove workers do not need to be members of NSQG. The white glove chairperson for 2012 is Susan Smith from Grand Island. Contact any member for Susan's contact information. Check the Nebraska State Fair web site for updates on the 2012 Entry Book and other information: www.statefair.org. We encourage carpooling of entries to and from the fair.

While we are now in what seems like the heart of our guild year it is time to start thinking about 2013. Volunteers will be needed to help take us through another year of camaraderie and quilt making encouragement. Jeannie Hecker, this year's vice president will be moving into the President's position but we will need a new vice president (who will be president in 2014), secretary, treasurer, newsletter editor and more. Ask not what your guild can do for you,

ask what you can do for your guild! We need YOU!

Do you have any "almost done" flower projects on the shelf? Well, take them down and get them ready to show because the County Fair Special Prize Rosette will go this year to the "BEST FLOWER QUILT"!
