# STATE FAIR NEWS Detailed info for entry of quilts in the 2010 NE State Fair will be available at the July meeting The Nebraska State Fair (NSF) 2010 Entry Book for Quilts can now be accessed online at www.statefair.org or copies of the entry book can be obtained from the NSF office, phone number 308-382-1620. Quilts may be entered online or by mail as per instructions in the entry book. Options for delivery of quilts include in person drop off or drop off at one of the designated sites in North Platte or Lincoln. The Lincoln site is the Hy-Vee store at 5020 N 27th Street. Time for drop off is 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Quilts can be picked up at the end of the fair in Grand Island or at the drop off site on September 8th from noon to 7:00 p.m. Any Nebraska resident may enter. You do not need to be a member of any guild. For the second year DOLL QUILTS will be an entry class at the NE State Fair with a special prize for best Doll Quilt sponsored by Dorothy Heideman-Nelson being presented in honor of our own Marian Fosler.
