# **June Meeting**

Mark your calendar and plan to attend the next meeting of the Blue Valley Quilt Guild on June 18th, 2012 at the Seward Civic Center.

Sign up sheets will be available at this meeting for members to sign up to volunteer as white glove helpers at both our annual 4th of July quilt show and this year's Seward County Fair quilt exhibit.

We will also be treated to a program presented by Tommie Jane (TJ) Lane of Thimbles by TJ Lane of Lincoln. TJ is in her 5th decade of creating jewelry, thimbles & sewing accessories and has a retail business with her finely crafted products being sold through her website & by vendors around the world. She also markets her thimbles through the Noyes Art Gallery in Lincoln as "fingertip rings". She will not only show us her art work but she will have examples available for purchase at the meeting with 10% of sales that night being donated to the guild.

TJ's thimbles are made and finished entirely in the USA with Billanti casting company of New York having made her molds and cast her thimbles and jewelry components since 1970. Finishing and setting gems is done in TJ's private home studio. She has never had a "brick and mortar" store front. TJ's thimbles and other sewing accessory art pieces are just that; works of art made from precious metals, gems, and other components and, as such, they sell at prices based largely upon the current materials market.

TJ Lane learned metalworking at the University of Arizona in Tucson in the 1960's. She loved the class so much she repeated it three times! TJ was a public school teacher before she began making jewelry full time. She taught silversmithing privately and at community college and wrote articles for Lapidary Journal and other magazines on silversmithing techniques, including how to make a thimble.

When TJ started offering her thimbles for sale, quilters and collectors were immediately attracted to her lovely, lightweight & comfortable thimbles and creative sewing tools. As TJ's business grew her daughter, Cynthia, and son in law, Matt, became involved. TJ does occasional events (such as speaking to our guild!) does repairs on pieces and fills orders as she continues to create new designs and take care of special orders. And TJ is truly one of us because In her *spare* time she creates quilted garments and skirts with swirl hemlines from her original designs!

How are those strippy little projects coming along? If you have sets of strips from our exchange it's time for a plan! Remember that the aim is to let the quilt "happen". No over thinking or over planning. This is a color exercise. Have fun and really PLAY!

Step one is to choose a simple block with which to work. The Shoo Fly pattern provided may be used but a Churn Dash, a Jacob's Ladder or any block that uses just three fabrics will work. You can make all the same block or mix together as many different ones as you like. Its your project and block size is up to you as long as you use your 3" strips.

Make as many blocks as you like with the combinations just as they were chosen at the meeting and then arrange them as desired (side by side, on point, with sashing or any way you like) and bring the result to the September meeting to show off your brilliant "color" sense and help show us all that, when it comes to fabric choice, color VALUE is the key!

## Shoo Fly Block


Cut 2 light and 2 medium 2 7/8" squares and cut diagonally for 1/2 square triangles (A)

Cut 4 light 2 1/2 inch squares. (B)

Cut one dark 2 1/2" square (B)

Join pieces as shown in diagram

Mix values at will, but use all 3 in each block!



## BVQG 2012 CHALLENGE — HOME SWEET HOMESTEAD

In honor of the 150th anniversary of the Homestead Act, our challenge this year is to make a quilt representative of what "homestead" means to you. It may evoke the pioneer spirit in you or bring to mind a home from your past, your current beloved "nest" or any structure man made, animal created, or natural that serves as a home. It could even be a quilt made from some type of block with a "homey" name but do include at least one log cabin block somewhere on the front of your quilt and add some lace, rick-rack or ribbon to the front too. Maximum size should be 144" all the way 'round (to accommodate space limitations at the fair); no minimum size...miniatures welcome! Quilts must have finished edges and be quilted. Choose your own fabrics; no packet this time. Have fun, create. and bring the result to the July meeting!

Spring Greetings! You may think it is way too early to think about the 2012 Nebraska State Fair Quilt Show, but I assure you – it will be here soon. We want you to start thinking now about additions being made to the State Fair Entry Book. Also – Please put these dates on your calendar and Please, Please be a volunteer to make this the best Nebraska State Fair Quilt Show ever!

#### 2012 Nebraska State Fair News

We are adding 4 new competition classes and 5 new special contests to the existing 70 competition classes and 18 special contests from last year.

The new classes are: a quilt from recycled components (i.e. old quilt blocks/tops or fabric or item originally designated for a purpose other than a quilt), a doll quilt class for adults (this is in addition to the two doll quilt classes for youth) and two additional Senior Adult classes (a throw quilt size and a bed quilt, mixed techniques).

The new special contests are: Best Scrappy Quilt, Best Humorous Quilt, Best Blue & White Quilt, Best Quilt from Southwest Nebraska Counties (Red Willow, Hitchcock, Dundy, Chase, Frontier & Hayes), and the Diamond Award to the best bed quilt in the Senior Adult classes made by someone 75 or over.

Can you help with White Gloving? We will need about 240 white glove workers during the eleven days of the State Fair from Aug. 24 through Sept. 3. There are three shifts per day: 9am-1pm, 1pm-5pm, and 5pm-9pm. Consider getting a group from your local guild to car pool, white glove and then see the rest of the wonderful fair. You will receive a free entry ticket to the fair on the day you work. White glove workers do not need to be members of NSQG. The white glove chairperson for 2012 is Susan Smith from Grand Island.
