#### **BVQG Survey Results**

Thank you to all 32 members who participated in the survey. There was a slight preference for trunk shows over demonstrations at the meetings, with most people checking both. No one volunteered to be on a committee to schedule programs for the year, but it's not too late!

Over half of the people responding (18) said they would rather pay higher dues than participate in fund raisers. 4 people said they would donate items to sell at a garage sale or craft show. 25 people are willing to sew blocks for a raffle ticket and 19 will sell tickets. 5 people said they would help sew the blocks together, but there were no volunteers to quilt it.

#### Comments added were:

Some people may not be able to pay higher dues.

Dues could go up to \$25 to help get guest speakers.

Raising dues will help, but may not be enough.

Increased dues should go for outside speakers not a quilt show.

22 of the 32 people responding said they had quilts to display at a quilt show in 2014. 15 people said they would serve on a committee for the show, with several asking not to be put in a leadership position. Becky Wallroff volunteered to co-chair and do quilt layout.

Janice Lippincott presented a program of "Wearable Quilts" from Blair and her friend June. Janice showed many jackets, vests, coats and skirts that she had made, and modeled many. Our guest, Nancy Eitel, brought an ornate quilted robe she found at an auction!

Lori Duffek and Laurie Grosser shared refreshments with our group following the program.

The Business Meeting was brought to order at 8:15 pm. The April Minutes and Treasury reports were accepted as printed.

President Jeanie Hecker reminded members that "Fun with Quilts" is the theme for our 4<sup>th</sup> of July quilt show. Anyone with quilts to contribute to the show is asked to bring them to the June quilt meeting. If that doesn't work, Jeanie has said quilts can be brought to her office anytime before the 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Jeanie read a thank-you note received by IQSCM chairman Dr. Pat Crews. Our contribution was a deferred speaker fee from Barb Pike.

Nebraska State Quilt Guild convention classes are filling up. If you have not signed up for the July 25-28 Seward NE event, go to the website and sign up as soon as possible. Anyone can attend the vendor mall and quilt show without advance registration. Jeanie teased all the members with a lot of clues for Name that Quilter until, finally, Connie Doering was guessed.

Gretchen Gebhardt, vice-president, recapped the results of a fund raising survey. Although a lot of members suggested raising the dues instead of intense fund raising, Gretchen showed us that our dues would have to be increased dramatically.

Becky Walroff has volunteered to be a co-chairman of a quilt show, but no one else has stepped forward at this time.

A discussion of a guild sponsored quilt show took place. Many comments were made concerning the amount of work that takes place compared with the number of visitors that came. Gretchen will take all the survey results, as well as comments, into consideration when planning the next Quilt Guild year. Jeanie presented a BVQG Quilt Show Costs Comparison sheet from the previous 3 guild shows. This report is found in the secretary's book.

Jeanie led a general discussion concerning how to get more involved in quilting. Ideas included information from Internet sites; Craftsy class ideas and favorite quilt websites.
