MEETING MINUTES AND TREASURER'S REPORT

The February 18, 2019 meeting of the BVQG was called to order by President Becky Wallroff with 28 members and 6 guests present. Our guests from Lincoln were Vickie Skodas, Joan Yoder, and Karen Babel. Also visiting were Cherie Johnson from Seward and Denny Fritsche from Milford. Our speaker, Bonnie Wagner is from Petersberg.

Linda Riesberg introduced Bonnie Wagner, Jan Stehlik's daughter who showed slides of her mother's quilts and told of Jan's accomplishments as quilt-maker, teacher, presenter, judge, historian and writer. Jan was inducted into the Nebraska State Quilt Guild Hall of Fame in 2018. Members shared memories of Jan Stehlik who was a charter member of our guild.

Bonnie Wagner gave a box of fabric to the quilt guild and everyone got to take home a piece. If members choose to participate, a piece of this fabric will be used in the 2019 challenge. Absent members can pick their fabric up at another meeting. Finished projects should be brought to the July meeting where members will vote for their favorite. These will be on display at the fair and visitors will vote for their favorite, but the pieces will not be critiqued by the fair judges.

2019 Challenge Requirements

- It must include a piece of Jan Stehlik's fabric.
- The sum of the sides of the finished piece cannot be more than 120 inches.
- It should honor Jan Stehlik's style of quilting. (Jan pieced, appliqued, embroidered, paper pieced, and taught many of these techniques. You will honor her by doing your very best work!)
- Embellishment of some kind is required.
- It must be finished and brought to our July 15th meeting.

need to be reserved soon. Other fund raising suggestions are welcome.

On March 18 Lora Rocke will have a trunk show and discussion on the changes in machine quilting.
