Since our regular meeting day, January 17th, is a work holiday for some, get "warmed up", yes, yes, pun very much intended, for the January meeting of the Blue Valley Quilt Guild which will be a working night for our guild, by attending a fun, informal sewing day.

If you are able, please come to the west room of the civic center basement starting at 1:00 pm (but feel free to come whenever you wish) to work on anything you like in the company of good friends. We'll transition later (after a break to grab a bite to eat and rest our weary fingers) into a working meeting during which we'll concentrate on quilts we can later donate in our community or to programs that serve those who are in need of some extra warmth, color and comfort.

One project that we can work on is the Bricks & Cobblestones quilt, or possibly several of them for which we made blocks in November. We can make more blocks at the upcoming meeting and put together those we get made. Bring fabric you want to use or donate, and any supplies you would like to bring; machine, ironing board, batting leftovers to use or donate, scissors, thread, tying materials...whatever you feel you/we will need. You can refer to the directions for the Bricks & Cobblestones blocks on page 4 if you want to cut strips or make blocks ahead.

Hope to see you at 1:00, anytime thereafter, or at least at the 7:00 meeting!

Helpful Hint

One thing we all dislike about prewashing quilting fabrics is all that pesky fraying. The fabric goes into the washer 42" x 36" all smooth edged and perfect and comes out 40" x 34" with threads wrapped around it like it's attempting to tie dye itself.

Now you have to unwind and trim off all the frayed threads and, after they come out of the dryer, they might have frayed some more, be wrapped up again, still wet in the creases and wrinkled up like the corners of Great Grandpa Joe's eyes.

One handy hint, that takes just a moment of your time can save you the frustration of all of the above. Just clip off a little triangular section from each corner of fabrics before you wash them. Try about 1/2" or a little less. You'll still see a *weensy bit* of fraying, but not enough to create all those nasty knots!




Instructions For Bricks & Cobblestones Service Quilt Block

The business meeting followed. The minutes and treasurer's report were approved as published in the newsletter.

November and December birthdays were recognized and those members were presented a fat quarter. The door prize was won by Kriss Moulds.

Bricks and Cornerstone blocks were turned in and members were reminded to bring theirs for charity quilts which will be worked on when enough blocks are received.

Raffle quilt winner was Dorothy Heidemann-Nelson who expressed her appreciation of the quilt and asked for members to sign who had not had the chance to do so previously.

No December meeting will be held. The meeting was adjourned and Show & Tell was held.
