
with Terry Clothier Thompson

CHINESE CHICKEN SALAD

Ingredients:

- 2 large cans Swanson white chicken breast (chopped up into bite-size pieces)
- 1 TBS poppy seeds
- 1/4 cup sesame seeds
- 1 head (or 2 bags pre-cut) green cabbage shredded
- 2 packages Ramen Noodles cooked per directions but don't use the flavor pack (I also chop them up a little)

Mix in large bowl, then add dressing:

Dressing:

- 3 tsp Accent seasoning (find it in the spices)
- 2 tsp salt
- 4 TBS sugar
- 4 TBS vinegar
- 1/2 tsp pepper
- 1/2 cup canola/vegetable oil see below
- * Mix the dressing ingredients together then drizzle in the canola/vegetable oil while still whisking to make an emulsion. Mix well with cabbage and refrigerate for at least a few hours until chilled.
